To the members and friends of Kunéix Hídi Northern Light United Church:

Grace and peace to you all! I am writing this letter to share with you that Bishop Cedrick Bridgeforth intends to appoint the Rev. Doctor Charles Ensminger as pastor of Kunéix Hídi Northern Light United Church beginning July 1, 2023.

This appointment was made in consultation with the PNC as they engaged in their search process on behalf of the congregation and has been affirmed by the leadership of the Northwest Coast Presbytery, by the church's staff parish team and by the bishop of the Holston Conference, the Rev. Deborah Wallace-Padgett.

Pastor Charles brings over 25 years of pastoral leadership experience serving primarily in the Holston Conference of the

United Methodist Church, his most recent appointment being at Allen Memorial in Athens, Tennessee. He completed his BA at Tennessee Wesleyan, and received an M.Div. as well as an M.A. in biblical studies from Drew University. His doctoral work was completed at the Methodist Theological School in Ohio. Charles has also served as an adjunct professor in the Religion Department of Tennessee Wesleyan since 2001 and he has authored several books. Charles will be accompanied by his spouse Cindy Ensminger who is a licensed Marriage and Family Counselor with a Master's degree from Seton Hall in New Jersey.

We ask that you please share this news with the congregation on Sunday, February 19th.

As of this reading, this news is only for your family of faith. This information is not public and should not be shared on social media until it is announced in an appointment express email from the Bishop's office. That email will almost certainly be sent on Monday morning.

In this time of transition we pray for Pastor Charles and Cindy and we also pray for God's grace and abundant blessing on the Rev. Dr. Laura Krauss. As a conference we want to express our deepest thanks to Pastor Laura for her gracious leadership of the congregation in her ongoing role as Interim Pastor. What a delightful gift she is to us all!

May God's spirit bless you, keep you and uplift you. We pray that your congregation will continue to grow from strength to strength. We give thanks for your faithful witness and the many ways you engage in ministries of love and justice here and afar.



Which Jeff was there in December 1988, scribbling under the pews?

Looking back at our church photo directory from 1989, we have two young people named Jeff: Jeff Grubb and Jeff Alter. Jeff Grubb would have been 15, Jeff Alter would have been about 16.

I decided to get in touch with those Jeffs and see if I can figure out this mystery.

I tracked down Jefferson Grubb and gave



him a call. He's living in Norfolk, Virginia and is a scientist serving in the Navy. He is a PhD Aerospace Experi-Psychologist. mental with the rank of Commander. He is concerned with safety issues and mishap investigations. He will reach 20 years of service next year and will retire and probably move to Florida, where his wife's family lives.


Maka Black Elk. Black Elk is the Executive Director for Truth and Healing at Red Cloud Indian School. He graduated from the school in 2005. After graduating from the University of San Francisco, he earned his Master's degrees in Peace & Human Rights Education at Columbia University's Teachers College and in Educational Leadership at the University of Notre Dame. Maka Black Elk returned to Red Cloud Indian School as a teacher and later an administrator before taking on his current role in 2022. Maka Black Elk's ancestor, Heaka Sapa, was commonly known as Black Elk (December 1, 1863 - August 19, 1950). He was wichasa wakhan ("medicine man, holy man") and heyoka of the Oglala Lakota people. He was a second cousin of the war leader Crazy Horse and fought with him in the Battle of Little Bighorn. He survived the Wounded Knee Massacre in 1890. He toured and performed in Europe as part of Buffalo Bill's Wild West.
