There is a somber element to Lent. It is a strange juxtaposition to Advent and the upbeat nature that is the Christmas season, even if there is something of a wariness to Advent. The *purpose* of Lent, though, is to provide a reflective time that deepens faith. It is a path designed to enable us to find joy in Easter as we contemplate the fact of the tomb. It is a journey, and one that we take together each year.

Lent begins with an exploration into the idea of mortality with Ash Wednesday and concludes on Holy Saturday, the Day of Silence after Good Friday. Lent is not for the faint of heart or the superficial of faith. It is a time of challenge. The rejoicing and Good News of Easter only comes after the Lenten journey and the Lenten journey is what should inform our celebration on Easter.

Lent is a time where we challenge ourselves to decide to take seriously our faith...or not. And what a time to consider our faith. In this time in which the voices of anger and mistrust are striving to speak to our darkest angels, we need to take the time that Lent offers

Church Council Prepares for Annual Transition

The 2023 Church Council held its last meeting on January 11, 2024. In February, the newly elected (at the Annual Meeting on January 21) Council members will join the continuing Council members to organize and begin serving.

New members (Class of 2026: Mary Becker, Monica Buettel, Karen Glass, and Marianne Mills) will succeed Class of 2023 members (Alan Akiyama, Denise Carroll, and Jim Alter) who are ending their terms. (However, Jim Alter will continue on the Council for one more year, in the Class of 2024 – filling a vacant position created by an earlier resignation.) Other Council members (Class of 2024: Maxine Richert, Sherrie Myers, Susan Bus; Class of 2025: Laura Doogan, Linda McCargar, Margaret Pugh, Margaret MacKinnon) have either one or two more years to serve.

At its January meeting, the Council:

- Approved the expenditure of \$23,500 in reparative funds for publication of a Commemorative Book focused on the history of the closing of the Memorial Presbyterian Church and the October 2023 apologies and reparations for that racist closure from Kunéix Hídi Northern Light United Church, the Northwest Coast Presbytery, and the Presbyterian Church (USA).
- Reviewed the year-end finances and made a couple of slight modifications to the December-approved, 2024 Budget
- Committed to the creation of a fund and plan for supporting music education in Juneau for Juneau children and youth, using earnings from the investment of the Louis and Ruth Anderson Music Education Fund.
- Discussed the increasing complexities and time-demands on the individual serving as Kunéix Hídi's Treasurer.

2024 Permanent Endowments Matching Challenge!

The Akiyama family had generously offered another challenge for donations to the Permanent Endowment Funds in 2024. They will match donations of up to \$14,000 to each fund, for Programs or for Capital Projects. Donations must be received no later than November 30 in order to meet the match. These Permanent Endowment Funds were created in 2021. Fund balances as of January 28, 2024, are \$77,383 for the Program Fund and \$53,091 for the Capital Projects Fund. Many in our congregation provide faithful help and are always eager to share this experience with new volunteers. There is always someone there who has done it before and knows the ropes.

Juneau to Pelican Ferry Trip 2024





A fun ferry trip is a one-day trip from Juneau/ Auke Bay to Pelican and return. This trip takes you around the northern tip of Admiralty Island, along Icy Strait, Point Adolphus (one of the best whale watching sites), across from Glacier Bay and Gustavus, through the Inian Islands (near Elfin Cove), down Lisianski Inlet to Pelican. The Inian Islands are a great place to possibly see otters and puffins! You stay 2 hours in Pelican, which is just enough time to walk along the boardwalks. There's an old church there which was used by Presbyterians at one time! The boat heads back along the same path. If you're on an Allen Marine catamaran, it only takes 4.75 hours; the ferry LeConte takes 7 hours.

This is the best sight-seeing trip to take in SE Alaska, according to Jane Ginter!

Several folks from church have purchased tickets for Thursday, February 15 on the Allen Marine Catamaran, including Pastor Charles and Cindy. Join in!

You can be an important part of what makes our worship together a good experience.

Our web site, https://khnluc.org/, offers a section where you can help with worship. You can also tell Christina to sign you up if you prefer not to use the computer.

Everyone is invited to be part of our worship service.

The liturgist reads the scripture and helps lead the service with the pastor. Sign up to be the liturgist.

You can serve as liturgist if you worship with us via Zoom.

The ushers greet people before the service, pass out bulletins, pass the offering plate, and assist with the prayers and announcements from the congregation. Sign up to be an usher.

The altar flowers are provided by the congregation. Sign up to provide flowers for worship.
