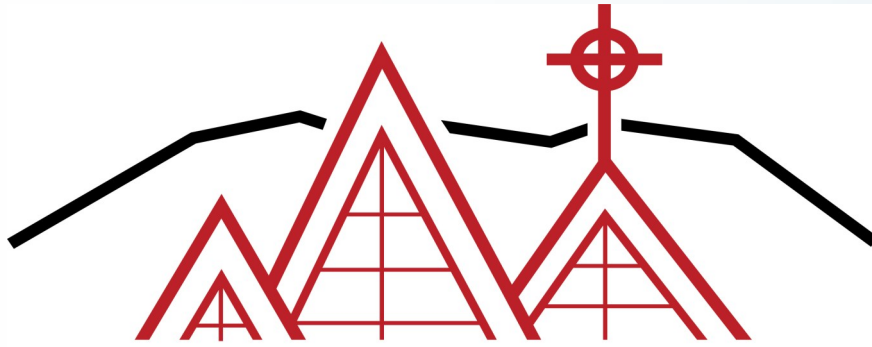

Molech and Mammon, Lent and Challenge

The 57th chapter of Isaiah is a somber, even aggressive prophetic utterance that begins by lamenting the idea that the righteous people die and the powerful seem not to care but, instead, go on about their business walking farther and farther away from God.

Within that lament is a particularly troubling section in which, as Robert Alter in his commentary on the Hebrew Bible suggests, holds a reference to a Canaanite deity named Molech to which people would sacrifice their children in the hopes of gaining favor with that god.

The point of the lament seems to be, as Paul Hanson put it, “a chaotic situation in which people, in their drift away from the God of compassion, hate justice, are indiscriminately attaching themselves to degrading cults [idols] that promise immediate satisfaction free of moral obligation.” Not only this, but those who have drifted away from God are willing (symbolically and, most frighteningly, perhaps literally) to sacrifice their children – the next generation – to get what they want.

Molech and Mammon, Lent and Challenge continued

I bring that to your attention because, as I once read from a rabbinical source (and I have long lost the reference, sadly), that the point may well be that God is calling the people to take care of their children, to take care of the next generation. Don't give them to Molech, bring them to God! Don't sacrifice their future, bring them to God who wishes to draw out their unique potential.

It's a sobering idea. God calls people to their fullest. Molech is a representation of the sacrificing of potential for the immediate gain of *now*. It is very much like the statement Jesus offers in Matthew 6:24, "No one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon." Likewise, one cannot serve God and Molech. Further, we are put in the mindset of Joshua who states, "choose this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your fathers served in the region beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you dwell; but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord." (Joshua 24:15)

The decision of direction and who or what we seek to follow is one to be faced in Lent. Lent is a time that should disabuse us from the idea that the Christian faith is about prosperity. God is not pouring the richest blessings onto Jesus. In fact, during this time Jesus is

going to struggle to do the will of God and on the cross even cry out that God has abandoned him.

Lent is not for the faint of heart or the superficial of faith. It is where we hear and see Jesus upend expectations of those around him and point to the Kingdom of God which is all around us but infrequently seen. The rejoicing and Good News of Easter only comes after the Lenten journey and the Lenten journey is what should inform our celebration on Easter.

So, I invite you to come and be a part of the Lenten journey from ashes to the grave as we follow Jesus to Jerusalem in sober, somber faith. Along the way, may we all learn what it is to follow Christ our Lord and may our eyes become clear enough to begin to see the Kingdom Jesus so passionately proclaimed.

Council Report

The Council met February 13, 2025. Selected officers are Mary Becker, Moderator; Maxine Richert, Vice Moderator; Margaret Pugh, Clerk; Margaret MacKinnon, Treasurer; Jane Ginter, Membership Secretary; and Mary Becker, Presbytery Representative. The Liaisons to Committees from Council are: Laura Doogan CPM, Monica Buettel Deacons, Susan Bus SJSC, Sasha Soboleff SPRC, Marianne Mills and Margaret Pugh Nominating Committee, Sherrie Myers Finance Committee, Maxine Richert and Mary Becker Healing Task Force.

We welcomed Sasha Soboleff as a newly elected Council member and said goodbye and thank you to Jim Alter for his many years of Council service.

The Council approved the recommendation of the Endowment/Investment Committee to move funds from Merrill Lynch to Raymond James due to our advisor team led by Peter Jurasz relocating to Raymond James.

The Anderson Music Grant Committee recommended disbursement of \$3000 for scholarships and \$3000 for Music Camp to the JAMM program. Council approved this disbursement. The Committee also recommended disbursement of \$1500 for scholarships and \$1000 for Music Camp for JSE (Juneau String Ensembles). The Council approved this disbursement.

SJSC requested that Council approve the expenditure of the \$10,000 that is set aside in the 2025 general fund budget and an additional \$15,000 from restricted funds to the Forget-Me-Not Manor so that they can purchase 28 beds for new apartments that are due to open in May. The Council approved a fund-raising drive to fund the additional \$15,000.

During reports Pastor Charles said a confirmation class will start on February 23 with the opportunity to join KHNLUC on Easter Sunday. The Ash Wednesday service will be held at 6:30 p.m. He is leading two Bible classes that are going well.

Maxine reported that she is working on the plans for the Memorial Hall refurbishing with the Healing Task Force and Native Ministries. Suggestions and ideas are welcome. The refurbishing of the men's bathroom and other building remodeling are being discussed.

Mary reported that the suggested amendments to the Book of Order were accepted by the Presbytery. There will be an additional four amendments discussed at the next Presbytery meeting.

The next Council meeting will be held March 13, 2025. The meetings are open and any are welcome to attend the meetings. The Zoom link can be found on the calendar on the khnluc.org website.

KHNLUC AWARDS \$8500 FOR MUSIC EDUCATION OF JUNEAU CHILDREN AND YOUTH

The Kuneix Hidi Church Council recently announced its decision to distribute \$8500 in earnings from the Anderson Music Education Endowment to two local groups committed to providing Juneau children and youth with music education in Juneau.

Award recipients are Juneau Alaska Music Matters and the Juneau String Ensembles. Both groups will use their award money for providing some of their string students with scholarships and, also, for helping to fund a Summer and/or Fall Chamber Music Camp.

The availability of the funds was announced and publicized in the latter part of 2024. Applications for use of earnings from the Anderson Endowment were due by the end of January 2025. Those applications were reviewed by the Church Council and award decisions were made at its February meeting.

The Ruth and Louis Eugene Anderson Music Education Endowment Anderson Music Education Endowment was established decades ago for support of organized groups providing music education in Juneau for children and pre-college youth. The endowment is administered by Kuneix Hidi. The Andersons were members of Memorial Presbyterian church and, after Memorial's closure, Northern Light United Church.

Prior to the end of 2025 Kuneix Hidi will again be soliciting proposals for future funding of music education of Juneau children and youth, in Juneau. For more information about this program, contact Jim Alter.

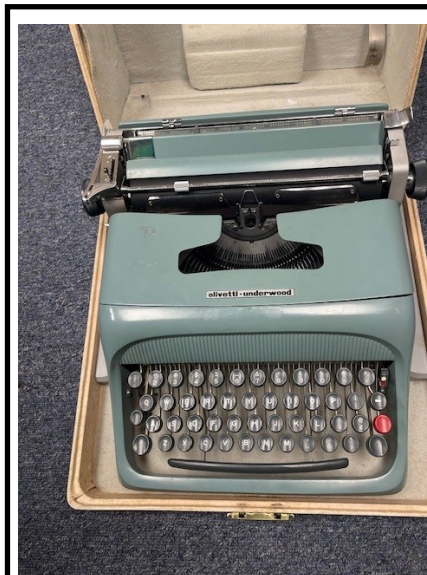
Glory Hall Needs
